One of the most blessed ministries and privileges is serving as a Eucharistic Minister in church or with those who are sick or homebound. The look on their communicant's face is a glimpse of heaven. This same look I saw every time I brought Eucharist to Tom Lux, Grace Jenkins, and Ty Keller in their holy anticipation, their deep faith, and their open hands and hearts. For them, their "AMEN" is *everything*. *Everything*.

Their always loud and clear AMEN served as a testament and affirmation of their belief in the Divine Presence in the sacred host placed in their hands. For them, the reception of the Body and Blood of Christ is strikingly profound, and never, ever something done as a routine. Like Augustine stated in one of his sermons on the Eucharist, "...one thing is seen, while anther is grasped." They got this!

Our AMEN is our signature on the Divine dotted line. Our AMEN is our affirmation of our Baptism. Our AMEN is our sacred response to what our minds, hearts, and our eyes cannot grasp.

During the Confirmation Mass, Braulio Mata, Angel and Marisol Ledesma received their First Holy Communion. I wish all of you could have seen their faces as they proclaimed their AMEN. It's the very same look I saw when Tom, Grace, and Ty received Communion. Their AMEN sums up ther pure joy, reverence, and desire for the Body and Blood of Christ.

Today, Athena and Gracie Spicer celebrate their First Communion. They are the daughters of Nelda, who adopted them several years ago. They were baptized at St. Stephen in 2018. The Body and Blood of Christ

Today we celebrate a glorious feast!

There are many names for this great gift given to us by Jesus:

~ Holy Eucharist

~ Blessed Sacrament

~ Holy Communion

~ Supper of the Lord

In 1264, Pope Urban IV started the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. He wanted all Catholic Christians to deepen their love and devotion for the Eucharist. This Feast is celebrated every year on the second Sunday after Pentecost.

How to Receive Holy Communion

Prepare your heart. At Mass pay attention to what is happening. Listen to the readings and prayers. Ask Jesus to ready your heart and to grace you to be grateful to receive him.

As you walk to the altar, *concentrate* on what you are doing and why you are doing it. Pray for an open heart to receive Jesus.

When you reach the altar, *look up* at the minister, listen for "Body of Christ". Extend your hands, one on top of the other, towards the minister and say, "Amen!" The minister will put the Body of Christ in your hands. Place the Eucharist in your mouth.

Proceed to the cup. The minister says, "Blood of Christ" and you respond, "Amen!" again ~ respond in loud, clear voice!


Return to your pew. *Thank Jesus* for coming to you. Pray for yourself to become just like Jesus. Pray for your family and the world to do the same.

Remember, don't eat or drink anything an hour before Mass, and don't chew gum or eat candy during Mass, either. This helps you to focus yourself on to what you are doing: you are about to receive the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist!
