Our Youth Group/Confirmadi are asking your help in preparing ACP dinners for five.


The prepared dinners will be donated to area families and to Tri-C Christian Ministries.

Morning Church!

Anyone who's experienced a trauma or a tremendous loss, understands the mind and heart of the disciples on the road to Emmaus. When you deal with a *crushed hope* you tend to lose your spirit. You reach out to others in the hope they will listen to and comfort you.

Jesus always shows up when you least expect him and when you most need him.

The post-Resurrection Emmaus walk is a model of ministry for all of us. Jesus joins the two disciples as they make their exit from Jerusalem. After some introductory banter, Jesus listens to their story of trauma and tremendous loss.

Jesus always shows up when you least expect him and when you most need him.

The natural, human tendency is to play the "fixer" and make every effort to remove the other's pain, and the discomfort you may feel in the sufferer's presence. Jesus makes no effort to take away their pain or to "fix" them. Instead, he listens to what they say and don't say. He remains present to them without interruption or judgment. In the most loving manner, he redirects their thoughts. He offers them the extraordinary grace of *remembering*. He knew one of the side effects of stress and every form of PTSD is *forgetfulness*.

Jesus knew they'd forgotten all the promises, made and kept, in Salvation History in their covenant with God. Hearing the witness of *HIS*tory, they are transformed and their hearts were rekindled in faith.



Pope Francis Encourages A Church of Emmaus

Using the Gospel story of Emmaus, Francis talked to the bishops about people who have left the church because they "now think that the church, their Jerusalem -- can no longer offer them anything meaningful and important." He does not blame the culture, he does not harangue against relativism, consumerism and other "isms"; rather, he calls for selfexamination by the bishops.

Perhaps the Church appeared too weak, perhaps too distant from their needs, perhaps too poor to respond to their concerns, perhaps too cold, perhaps too caught up with itself, perhaps a prisoner of its own rigid formulas, perhaps the world seems to have made the church a relic of the past, unfit for new questions; perhaps the church could speak to people in their infancy but not to those come of age. Faced with this Emmaus encounter, Francis suggests:

We need a Church unafraid of going forth into their night.

We need a Church capable of meeting people on their way.We need a Church capable of entering into their conversation.

We need a Church able to dialogue with those disciples who, having left Jerusalem behind, are wandering aimlessly, alone, with their own disappointment, disillusioned by a Christianity now considered barren, fruitless soil, incapable of generating meaning.

Are we still a Church capable of warming hearts?

A Church capable of leading people back to Jerusalem?

Of bringing people home?

Jerusalem is where our roots are:

Scripture, catechesis, sacraments, community, friendship with the Lord, Mary and the apostles.

Are we still able to speak of these roots in a way that will revive a sense of wonder at their beauty?



With his usual humility, the Pope admitted that he and the bishops are lagging in what he calls "pastoral conversion" and could do better. He sets a high standard to which he and other bishops should aspire.

Bishops must be pastors, close to people, as fathers or brothers, gentle, patient, and merciful. Men

~ who love poverty, both interior poverty, as freedom before the Lord, and exterior poverty, as simplicity and austerity of life.

- \sim do not think and behave like "princes."
- ~ who are not ambitious
- ~ who are married to one Church without having their eyes on another.
- ~ capable of watching over the flock entrusted to them and protecting everything that keeps it together, guarding their people out of concern for the dangers which could threaten them, above all instilling hope, so that light will shine in people's hearts.
- ~ capable of supporting with love and patience God's dealings with people.

Bishop must be among his people in three ways:

- \sim in front of them, pointing the way
- ~ among them, keeping them together and preventing them from being scattered
- behind them, ensuring that no one is left behind ~ also, and primarily, so that the flock itself can sniff out new paths.

It is clear from this description Francis has made pastoral qualities a high priority in the selection of new bishops.

If he is successful in finding such bishops, a new style of leadership will spread from Rome throughout the Catholic world.

When you read the Bible, especially the Gospels you can be like the two disciples in today's Gospel. Jesus will speak to your heart and help you know how much he loves you.




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
