between the pew and the kneeler.





Prayer in Romero's Words

Ant. We are prophets of a future not our own.

It helps, now and then,
to step back and take a long view.

The kingdom is not only beyond
our efforts, it is even beyond our vision.

We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction
of the magnificent enterprise
that is God's work.

Nothing we do is complete,
which is a way of saying
that the kingdom always lies beyond us.

No statement says all that could be said.
No prayer fully expresses our faith.
No confession brings perfection.

No pastoral visit brings wholeness.
No program accomplishes
the church's mission.
No set of goals and objectives
includes everything.

This is what we are about.
We plant the seeds that one day will grow.

We water seeds already planted,
knowing that they hold future promise.

We lay foundations
that will need further development.

We provide yeast that produces far beyond
our capabilities.

We cannot do everything,
and there is a sense of liberation
in realizing that.

This enables us to do something,
and to do it very well.

It may be incomplete,
but it is a beginning, a step along the way,
an opportunity for the Lord's grace
to enter and do the rest.

We may never see the end results,

between the master builder and the worker.

We are workers, not master builders;
ministers, not messiahs.

Morning, Church!

God’s Word creates on continuing reflection on our personal and communal efforts for full conversion to Christ, imaged in two different trees, one a burning bush in Genesis and the other, a dying, unfruitful fig tree in Luke. Both trees can inspire and cause fear.

The God of Our Ancestors inspires us and Moses in each sacred encounter. A tree ablaze, yet now consumed, is Divine Presence and Power. This blazing bush called Moses and us to renewed, reverential worship and conversion. God called Moses to witness to Saving Presence and Power. God had rescued Moses from slavery in Egypt and called him to be an leader and an instrument of justice and compassion for The Chosen.

In the gospel, The Fig Tree, is anything but ablaze with power and presence. Despite human care and Earth’s resources, the fig tree resisted bearing fruit. It neither inspires nor graces its gardner or passersby. The Fig Tree is an apt Lenten image for all who desire “the more”, “the deeper”, and the “life-giving” on this faithjourney. Jesus uses this particular fig tree as an image of what is and what can be ~ in grace.

It’s not enough to merely exist. Your faithjourney is all about “the more”, “the deeper”, and the “life-giving” right now, rather than postpone a fuller faith life. *NOW* is the time. *TODAY* is the DAY to search your heart, your personal fig tree and scrutinize what needs to be pruned, irrigated, or fertilized.

*It’s another honest-to-God conversation
God desires to have with you today..*

On this day, around the world, the *RCIA Rite of Scrutiny* is solemnly celebrated on the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent. Today, we join with Martha Neaves, as we pray this Rite together. The meaning and purpose of this Rite for Martha ~ and all of us ~ is to look into our hearts, to scrutinize what is graced, and what has yet to be graced, what is ablaze with God’s presence and what is fruitless and dying like the fig tree.

The solemn Rite of Scrutiny is a “...rite of self-searching and repentance” for Martha, for the whole Church. It is meant to “uncover, then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in our hearts as well as bring out, then strengthen, all that is upright, strong, and good.”

Let this be our prayer for one another and for Martha.



See what the two men want to do with it by reading what they say in a mirror.

What Kind of Fig Tree are You?



In today's Gospel reading, we hear a parable about a fig tree. The owner waited three years for it to grow some figs, but it still wasn't producing any. He told the gardener to cut it down. But the gardener said he would try just for one more year to get it to bear fruit- and if it didn't give any then he would cut it down.

The fig tree is like a person who can do good things but doesn't. The owner shows the justice of God- he has given the tree enough chances so its time is up. But the gardener is like God's mercy. He wants to give the tree one more chance. And he's going to give it extra fertilizer to try to help it.



Lent is a good time to look at our own life and see if we are doing all the good things we can. Maybe there's something nice that we know we could do for someone but we just never bother to. Or maybe we aren't praying quite as much as we know we should. God is giving us a chance to become better people this Lent, and it's your job to make it happen!
