Morning Church!

The term *quarantine* took center stage during this pandemic. Sixty years ago, *quarantine* had a different meaning. October 16-29, 1962, the U.S. imposed a naval quarantine on Cuba, for allowing the Soviets to build missile sites there. Kennedy said the quarantine would remain until Khrushchev dismantled and removed these missiles. Khrushchev continued to send building materials for the missiles to Cuba.

The naval quarantine thwarted the Soviet ships' access to Cuba. Instead of a knee-jerk military response, Kennedy decided to use diplomatic back channels and exchanging communique instead. Khrushchev sent a message to Kennedy demanding that the U.S. remove their missile sites from Italy and Turkey.

When that happened Khrushchev said the missiles would be removed from Cuba. Kennedy delayed response agitated Khrushchev, who sent a second, more threatening communique. Advised by his brother, Bobby, Kennedy ignored the second message and answered the first. Until that moment, the world shuddered on the brink of WW III. After 13 days, the quarantine proved effective. The Soviets removed the missiles from Cuba and the U.S. did the same in Italy and Turkey. The Cuban Missile crisis had come to a peaceful end. *"When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end."*

Evil's threat of war is always present. Power-seeking bullies like Kim Jong-un and Vladimir Putin demand a response from the world community. Peaceful nations must band together, resist and push back against these despots' destructive, life-threatening policies. Neglecting to do so enables lawlessness and darkness to fester, breed, and gain more real estate in God's Neighborhood.

The college student lamented how he takes a lot of flack from his peers because he won't go drinking till they're all drunk. He refuses to compromise his relationship with his out-of-state girlfriend, while his peers do the opposite. They persecute and mock him for being uptight and "not taking advantage of his situation." He's said, "That's not who I am or want to be. That's not the way I want to live my faith." He is finding out that some wars aren't global, they're local.

"...they will seize and persecute you...you will be hated because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your life."

In the crises/mini wars you encounter, like arguments with your spouse, children, boss, or relatives, are you able to quarantine the cause of your crisis? Do you use your diplomatic skills to maintain the relationship until you resolve the standoff? That's the virtuous way. It's harder and more time-consuming. In the end, it's the most life-giving way. Only the gospel way secures your life.

Do you find it kind of scary thinking about the end of the world or dying? Well, you don't need to be afraid about it! Jesus will give us all the strength we need for whatever happens.



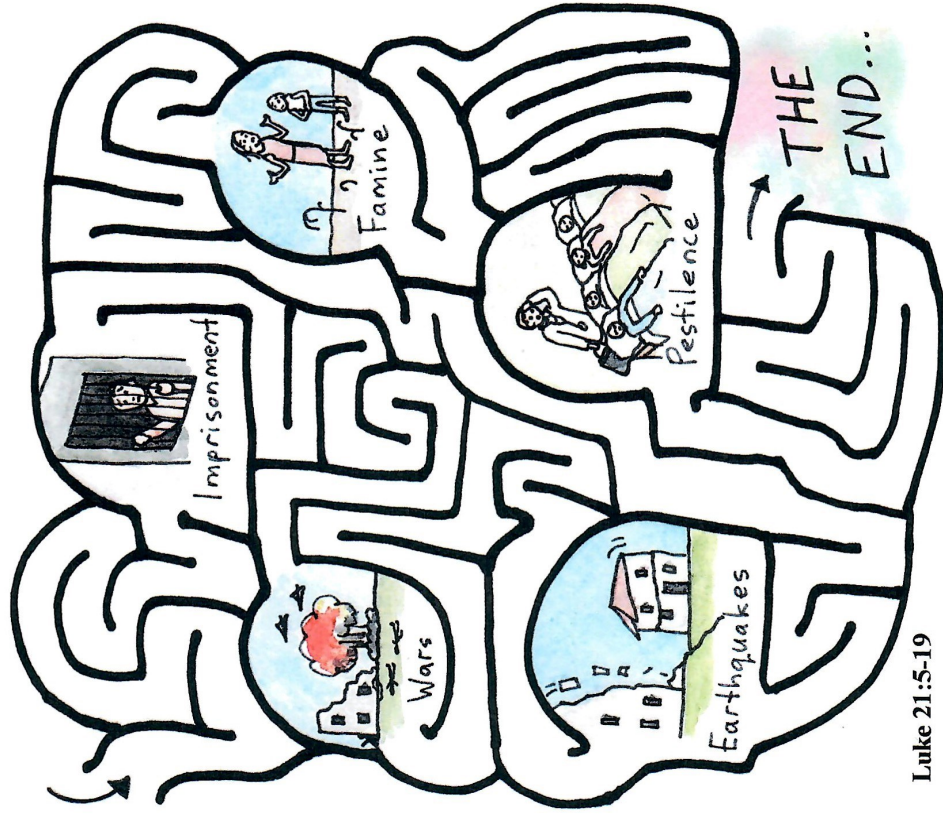
