One of this year's Oscar-nominated songs is, "What Was I Made For?" from the movie "Barbie". Its lyrics are a marvelous source for our Lenten reflection, especially as we celebrate the Rite of Scrutiny the next three weeks with Stephen, Jacob, and Ethan.

Think I forgot how to be happy
Something I'm not, but something I can be
Something I wait for
Something I'm made for
Something I'm made for

The Rite of Scrutiny is ...".meant to uncover and heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the Elect and to bring out and strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good... ...to deepen the Elect's resolve to hold fast to Christ..." #141

The Church is intentional in celebrating our Rites in the presence of the parish faith community, so all of us can reflect on our own need for ongoing conversion.

To scrutinize is a *spiritual discovery process* meaning to *examine closely*. It is meant to be done with humility and transparency, like looking in a mirror and seeing ourselves as we are and as God sees us. This Rite is like a cleansing of our soul temple. Through its prayers, we identify our compulsions or addictions, and we begin to overturn the death-dealing choices as we strive to replace them with life-giving ones.

In scrutinizing our hearts, we take a closer look at our choices: How am I glorifying God with my life? (worship/praise) How am I glorifying myself? (selfishness/sin)

Scrutinizing our lives is like The Daily Examen. In this spiritual exercise in which we review our day, thoughts, experiences, action, and words, as we ask ourselves:

When did I make loving choices today? (worship/praise) When did I make selfish choices today? (selfishness/sin)

In the Book of Exodus, the Ten Commandments are seen as a legal guide to help The Chosen and us scrutinize what the most consistent paths of our faithjourney are.

Are these paths we choose *The Way*?

Glorifying God with our lives is what we were made for, and Someone we're made for.

The money-changers were very greedy ∼ even in God's holy Temple! Dear God, help me be generous in my giving.


Help me to be generous when I am helping others.
