Morning Church!

As Jesus, the rabbi, teacher, and healer made his way around the Holy Land, he recognized the overwhelming needs of the people. Jesus will need help if the proclamation of the Reign of God is to reach the ends of the Earth. The possible harvest is great, yet the laborers ~ those committed to Christ's mission, are few.

When I first arrived at St. S in October, 2006, I observed how our parish family worshipped and interacted. As folks gathered for Mass they entered, got in a pew and kinda stayed to themselves. One Sudnay after Mass I asked someone the name of the person that had been sitting beside her for the past month. "I don't know her name. She comes with her husband but we've never spoken." I asked, "Is this couple new to St. S?" "No, they've been here as long as I have." "How long is that?", I asked. "About twenty years", she said.

As weeks went by I noticed after a few weekend Masses that the same 10-15 parishioners served in every liturgical ministry. So, one Sunday, I asked everyone before Mass, "How many here are baptized Catholics? Raise your hands." Some children and every adult raised their hand.

I said, "In Baptism you are anointed priest (to minister): prophet (to speak out against injustice and to point to a future full of hope); and king/leader (by word and example you lead others to Christ). So for the next two weeks reflect and pray about one liturgical ministry in which you are willing to serve in and share your faith. Every adult needs to pick one. I'll prepare you for whatever ministry you choose."

Two weeks later, Liturgical Formation and Information sessions were posted and St. S went from a handful of liturgical ministers to almost every single household having at least one adult serving on Sundays. The great harvest would now be served by many more who are willing to labor for Christ. Your willingness to serve and the new diocesan program, *Why Catholic? (WC)* transformed your community. The energy in the church before Mass elevated because at the *WC?* you had the opportunity to get to hear each others' stories and get to know one another better. One of *WC's* early skeptics, Bern Moran, went all in on *WC* and hosted a group in her home!

So, what about the harvest now? What about the ongoing mission of Christ in your life today? How are you serving now and being faithful to the "yoke of the Rabbi" who called and consecrated you for ministry? What does it mean to follow Jesus today?

You did not choose Christ. Christ chose you to be one of his disciples, to follow him faithfully, to leave behind your "fishing boats" or tax collector "table" and just follow him. Abundantly blessed with so much, you are called to abundantly share who you are and whose you are ~ to proclaim the Reign of God for the life of the world. That's a daily, momentous invitation. Go, make a difference!

The Mass is ended. Go forth to glorify God with your lives!



Jesus sent His Apostles to the surrounding towns to preach and heal. Can you find the way to the nearby town for the Apostles?


