Jesus said to his disciples:

"I have come to set the earth on fire,

From now on a household of five will be divided, three against two and two against three; a father will be divided against his son and a son against his father, a mother against her daughter and a daughter against her mother, a mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law."

Morning Church!

The discovery of fire 2.0 million years ago elevated human experience providing light; heat; the curative cleansing and cauterizing of wounds; protection; and a new means of food preparation. On your faithjourney, fire symbolizes spiritual purification that leads to ongoing conversion and deeper faith.

Fire is mentioned throughout scripture as the hovering pillar over the desert-wandering Hebrews; as God's presence on the burning bush that didn't consume it; and as the tongues of fire over the apostles on Pentecost symbolizing the power and presence of the promised Advocate.

Today's gospel is strikingly confrontational, a style Jesus reserved for The Hypocriticals of his day. Jesus' presence did create a fire storm to the established way of being in relationship with God and one's neighbor. He taught the New Law is Love, especially of those deemed The Insignificant, The Diseased, The Foreigner, The Women, The Children, The Tax Collectors, The Vulnerable, Those who are Poor, and the Prostitutes. The divisions, then and now, are deeply drawn in the sands of society.

In addition to these divisions in Christ's day, we experience division in our family, our Church, our society, and in our political area. The Dividers are the destructive fire.

Division in our Church is scandalous to nonbelievers. When Pope Francis sets a spiritual vision and gives directives to our faith community only to get pushback from bishops and those who have, for 60 years, fought and ignored the vision of Vatican II, this creates a public scandal. If it's one thing the Church doesn't need is another scandal. In diocese across our country, including our own, priests ignore our Pope's liturgical directives and, without permission, continue to say Mass in the Tridentine Rite, with their backs facing the community. The Dividers are the destructive fire.

In the political area, The Dividers, who created and perpetuate The Big Lie, and who engaged in a horrific insurrection on January 6, seem to be a destructive fire that resists being extinguished. The Dividers are the destructive fire.

Our American society is deeply wounded by the divisiveness of economic injustice, racism, gun violence, corporate consumptive behavior and the abuse of Creation. Families torn apart by one of our most divisive elections, have yet to reconcile five years later. The Dividers are the destructive fire.




