Prayer Shepherds Us.

Morning, Church!

At Tuesday's Communion Service we were confronted by God's call for *daily* conversion. God's Word retold how the Prince of Darkness' divisiveness is so visible... January 6, 2021's hostile attack on our Capitol and on our democracy...innumerable acts of gun violence... the heated. political rhetoric of the past ten years...Russia's invasion of Ukraine...the centuries-long tribal war in the Middle East...racism and every other "isms" that divide our hearts...gruesome school shootings...the world-wide migration of refugees...last week's recent assassination attempt on a presidential candidate...deep darkness seems to abound...

From where I stand, The Darkness will *never* overcome the Light ~ if we live what we say we believe, if we stand over and against all that strives to divide God's Children in our nation and throughout the world.

The cumulative violence of the past decade is utterly mind-boggling! It can numb us into apathy and inaction. The faith we proclaim *demands* we speak up and stand together in the faith and values we hold in common.

This is no time for a nap, for "checking out". The conflicts and violence around us, and perhaps, within is, demand "deep, soaking prayer" and doing everything we can to bring Christ's light and love wherever we are. The gospel *obligates* us to speak Christ's truth in love and to listen to others with respect and attention.

We cannot wait for someone else to take the first step. Peace, justice, understanding and reconciliation happen wherever our feet are. We are the ones we've been waiting for, we're Christ's shepherds here and now.

We must *listen attentively and love courageously* (SSJ 2024 Chapter theme), forgive first, and create a climate where all feel heard and respected.

Reflecting on the Word

Prayer shepherds us..

It starts with surrendering to Christ in "deep, soaking prayer" that can change our heart, as my sister, said, "deep, soaking prayer is the only answer. Always."

Prayer shepherds us.

Prayer is our soul's most influential and graceful mentor.
Prayer prepares us to minister, among our
Dear Neighbors. Prayer readies our hearts to see, hear, and respond with compassion, presence, and empathy to their pains and concerns.

Let's make renewed efforts to pray every day for the disarmament of our hearts, our own conversion, and for the grace to be Christ's presence in justice, compassion and light.

Let's pray for the grace to the lead of our Divine Shepherd, who "gathers, tends and feeds his flock with loving care.

If we're conscious at all, prayer, *especailly the Eucharist*, will grace us to hear and be sensitive to our own pain and broken sinfulness. Prayer is our light of grace against the darkness around and within us.

Jesus shepherds us in prayer: deep, soaking prayer.
Pray. Ask him him to change our hearts and grace us to be People of The Light, People of Justice and Peace.
This is <u>not</u> the time for a nap.

Part of my homily....

HARSH! "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida!...and Capernaum: ...But I tell you, it will be more tolerable for the land of Sodom on the day of judgment than for you."

If I were the Devil... I mean, if I were the Prince of Darkness, I would, of course, want to engulf the whole earth in darkness. I would have a third of its real estate and four fifths of its population... I would not be happy until I had seized the ripest apple on the tree, so I should set about however necessary to take over the U.S.

I would begin with of a campaign of whispers. With the wisdom of a serpent, I would whisper to you as I whispered to Eve: "Do as you please." "Do as you please." To the young, I would whisper, "The Bible is a myth." I would convince them that humans created God instead of the other way around. 

Have you ever been asked to help someone when you were tired? It isn't easy, is it?


But we can learn from Jesus that no Can matter how tired we are, we should help to there who still be ready to help others who make are in need.







