Reception of the Body of Christ



If you choose to received the Eucharist in your hands:

- ~ Approach the altar with your right palm on top of your left or vice versa. Prayerfully *set one palm on top of the other.*
- ~ When it is your turn to receive, make a reverent bow, then approach the EM.
- ~ When the Minister says, “Body of Christ”, you respond, “AMEN.”
- ~ With your free hand, reverently place the Host in your mouth before leaving the altar.
- ~ Then return to your seat and join in the Communion Song and then the time of thanksgiving.



If you choose to received the Eucharist on your tongue:

- ~ Approach the altar with your hands prayerfully folded; Make a slight bow before the EM in preparation.
- ~ After the Minister says, “Body of Christ, you respond, “AMEN!”
- ~ Put your head back, open your mouth as wide as possible, and extend your tongue forward to received.
- ~ Then return to your seat and join in the Communion Song and then the time of thanksgiving.

Harvest: Certainty & Uncertainty

LUKE 10:2

Morning Church!



With the 2022 liturgical revisions, we asked to learn new ways of repending to the prayers during Mass. Our present Order of Mass gives us several options for the Penitential Act and the *Lord, have mercy*. One form uses the Greek words, Kyrie eleison and Christe eleison. version Eleison means “*loving kindness*”, and translates into English as “*mercy*”. Every time we gather around the sacred Tables of Word and Sacrament, we are gathering in God’s mercy so that we will cultivate mercy in our relationships.

The prophet Isaiah personifies Jerusalem as a *merciful* mother who comforts her Children in Exile. In merciful love, God has forgiven the betrayal of the Chosen People and returned them to their beloved home, Jerusalem. We, who live in the New Jerusalem, the Church, are graced in merciful love through the Sacraments we celebrate, and in our lives shared together in prayerful presence, faith sharing, and through the witness we give in right relationship, compassionate justice, and generous service. Oh, how we desire the comforting presence of God these days so wounded with divisiveness, lies, and greed...

In Galatians, Paul encourages us to boast only about God’s *merciful love* poured out on all who have become a New Creation in the Cross of Christ. Today, God’s *merciful love* is poured on Bastian Leon Barrientos, nephew of parishioners /godparents Elia and Luis Martinez. He’s the son of Alma and Jose Barrientos (Elia’s brother). Why did they come all the way from Illinois to have their son baptized at our church? The last time they were here their family celebrated former parishoner Gloria Garcia’s Mass of Christian Burial. Gloria’s Elia and Jose’s sister. Bastian’s parents found merciful love here then, so they’ve come back to St. S for Bastian’s baptism.

The gospel calls us to collaborate in Christ’s Mission of Mercy. Like the 72 disciples in Luke, our 72 households are sent to give witness to God’s *merciful love* wherever we are. Collaborating with Christ, we become God’s *visible mercy* shared in unbiased service and presence.





In this time of relentless uncertainty, many feel exiled from what used to be certain. Our faith teaches us we can always be certain that God’s abundant mercy surrounds and comforts us. Reaping a rich harvest of justice for God is laborious and will take *all of us* laboring to bring *all of us* home.



God’s presence, commitment, and mercy are unquestionable.
These concerns are truly ours alone.

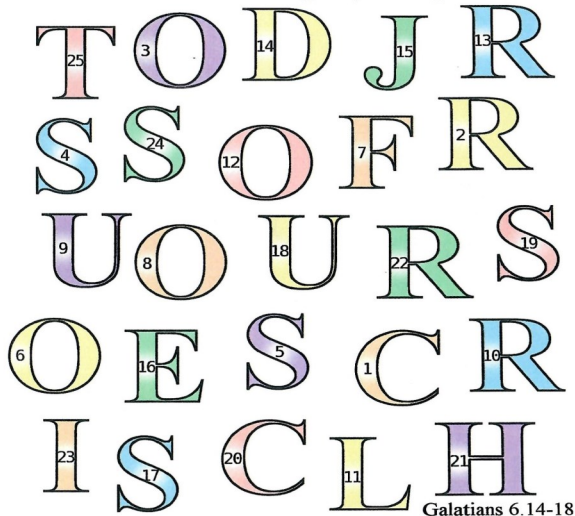

Jesus compares the townspeople to a harvest. When the farmer's crops are ready, the harvest must be gathered from the field. It takes a lot of people to do this work.

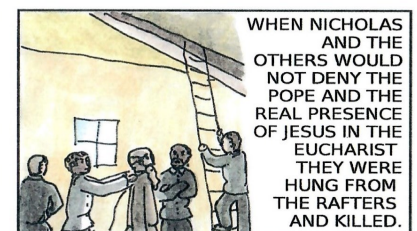
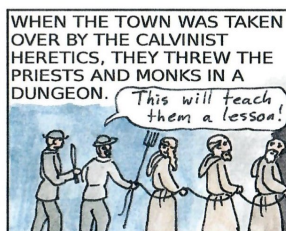
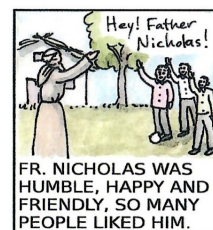
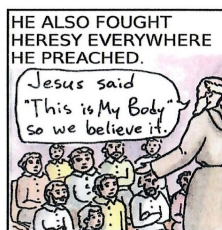
